Water treatment for drinking water requires balancing the requirements of different regulations to assure compliance with the National Primary Standards. Knowing the basics for the different treatments, as for disinfection, is key for delivering safe drinking water to the public.

The training will focus on the basics of disinfection, the applicable regulations and key compliance issues that affects water quality in the distribution system.
